What's Ahead?

Students recently received information from their Class Dean, Rob Bellin, about signing up for virtual academic advising appointments this summer. This will be an opportunity for your student to meet 1:1 with a faculty member and talk through their course interests, ask questions they might have about upcoming academic deadlines, and feel better prepared for enrollment. There are a handful of <u>academic deadlines</u> in June, so please encourage your student to check their email and sign-up for advising if they haven't already. Student Accessibility Services

If your student believes they may need accommodations (academics, housing, or dining) due to a disability, we encourage them to start the request process now with our wonderful team in the <u>Office of Student Accessibility Services</u>.
